IDD SEXUAL VIOLENCE PREVENTION TRAINING

- IDD persons and families (n=29)
- Blanket talks for Native American families (n=1)
- Sexual Assault Response Team Training (n=44)

SUSTAINING AND EXPANDING SERVICES

- **\$30,000** Louise Oriole Burevitch Endowment grant to sustain training for IDD Native American families
- **5** IDD SV assault case consults across NC
